I was hit in leg by flak. Pilot was wounded. Nobody killed.

What members of the crew bailed out? Did their parachutes open?  
Myself, S/Sgt NORRIS and T/Sgt WILLIAMS - the 'chutes opened.

Did the plane explode on striking the ground? No.

Did source see any other members of the crew dead or alive after reaching the ground? No.

Did he receive any information from others as to whether any other members of the crew were dead or alive? If so, give details furnished by his informant and whether the other crew members were identified by name or otherwise. Information received indicated all were alive. Sgt WILLIAMS was captured as well as two or three others. One was wounded - not known.

**Ball turret gunner and left waist gunner bailed out.**

**Everyone I saw were alive.**
